Actively seek to enhance the diversity of speakers, panellists and moderators at NELA events, including diversity across disciplines and in culture, language and ability.

Enhance benefits for NELA members. and identify members' expertise and specific interest areas in environmental

> law and policy through sign-up forms and surveys. Launch Climate Change and

Biodiversity Working Groups. These groups enable NELA members to collaborate with like-minded individuals within the NELA community to assist NELA to develop policies, strategies, and initiatives that directly address the impact of significant environmental concerns. The groups enable members to engage in meaningful work that can positively impact the environment by identifying and addressing gaps in current environmental policies, regulations, and laws.

Build NELA's membership base through active engagement, and advocating for positive environmental outcomes

Seek continual improvement in Board governance arrangements, consistent with the AICD Principles of Good Governance for Not-For-Profits (NFPs).

Upskill key Board officers with training, mentoring and other resources to maximise their effectiveness in the role.

Ensure NELA has the necessary policies and registrations to support its position as a national peak body for environmental organisations.

Review policies for mitigating cyber, technology and data risks and implement risk mitigation measures.

Undertake and publish NELA's ESG impact assessment (July - September
